HISTORY

Hence the club motto “Més que un club” which translates to “more than a club”. “More than a club” is at the heart and soul of FC Barcelona, and is transferred to its world- renowned youth soccer system, BARÇA Academy. This means the unique Barça game philosophy and style you see in the world-famous Spotify Camp Nou, FC Barcelona’s home stadium in Barcelona, Spain, is the same that Barça Academy players will try to implement and practice every day following the same club’s training methodology



The Anthem

The **'Cant del Barça'** song was composed in 1974 and is now the Club's anthem. It was written for the Club's 75th anniversary by the writers Josep M. Espinàs and Jaume Picas, with music by Manuel Valls, and is still completely relevant. LA MASIA

FC Barcelona's youth academy.

La Masia, translated to "The Farmhouse" in English in honor of the original academy house, is the term used for FC Barcelona's youth academy located in Spain.

The Academy currently includes more than 300 young players and is the first youth academy in the world to have trained all three finalists for the Ballon d'Or in a single year (Andres Iniesta, Lionel Messi, and Xavi). The Academy has been a significant factor in FC Barcelona's European success.

Many attribute FC Barcelona's success to the La Masia "Philosophy of Play" which all players learn.

This philosophy consist of the application of the "love the ball" paradigm, where the ball takes a protagonist role in how the players understand the game, which significantly impacts their decision-making.

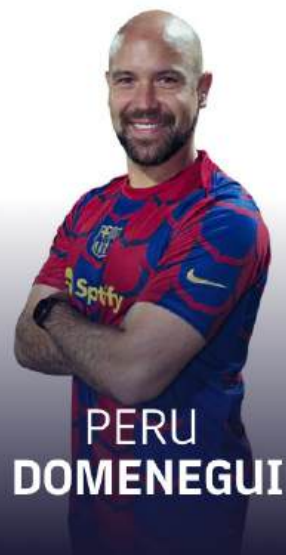

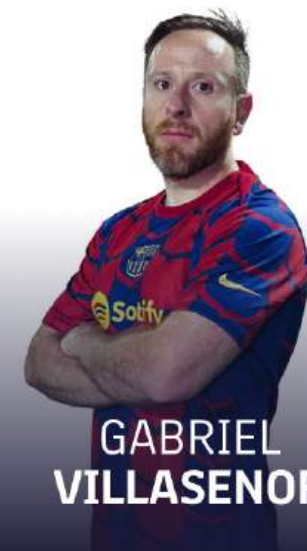

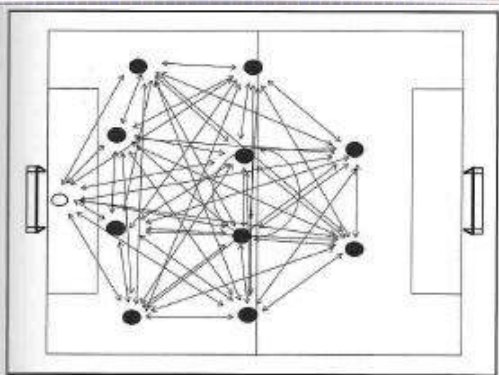


TEAMS – Finding the balance

Team Formation Process

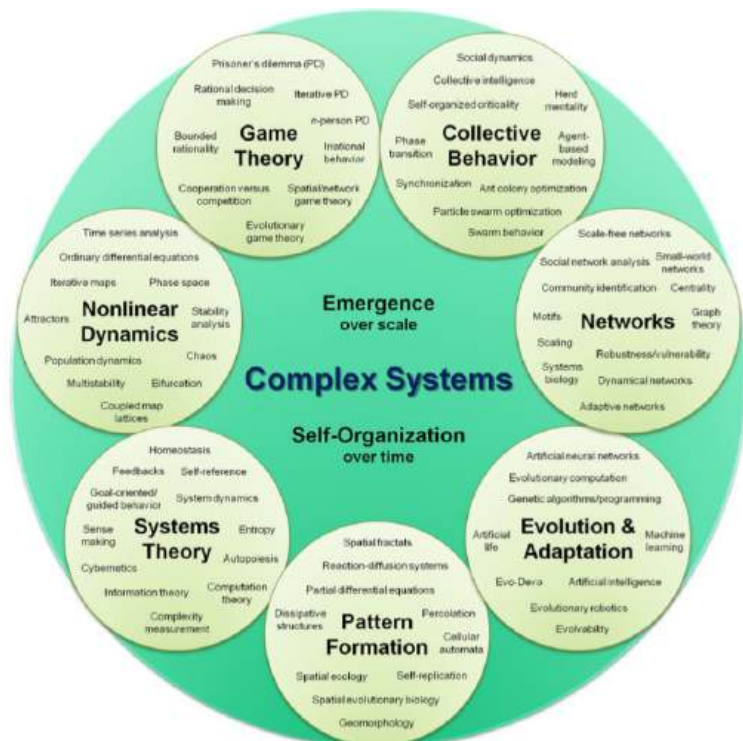
At BARÇA Academy Chicago, teams are formed primarily based on player **development needs, observed level, and the best context for growth.**

- Players are grouped by **skill level**, normally by age, to ensure that each player is challenged at the right pace and surrounded by the appropriate environment.
- Our staff evaluates players throughout the **Fall, Winter, and Spring** seasons through training sessions and matches, and changes are made only when clearly beneficial to the player and team dynamics.
- We aim to maintain **a consistent team block** during each season to ensure stability and team cohesion.
- **Whenever possible, same coaches will remain with their groups** if we believe continuity benefits the team and the coach's performance merits it. This dynamic structure helps us stay true to our commitment: providing each player with the best possible environment to grow, improve, and enjoy the game.

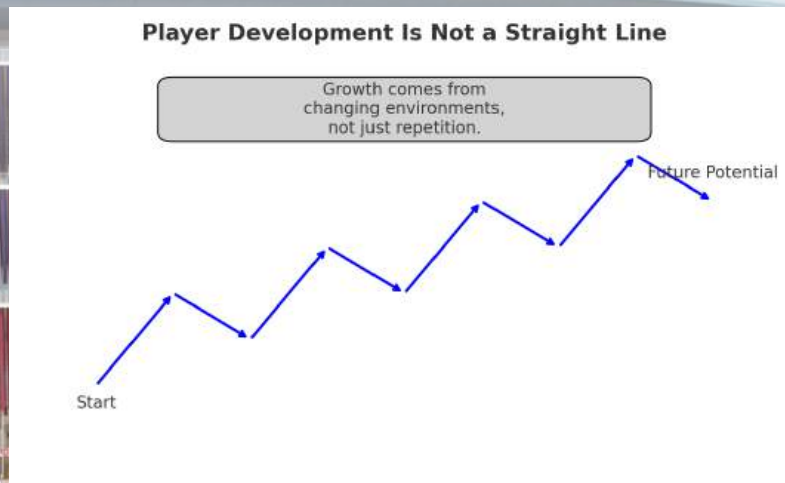
•**Staying+Promoting**: +++ Confidence + les comfort

What is the Internal League and Why Is It Important?

The Internal League is a specially designed competition created to reinforce learning and accelerate development in an environment we control entirely. Every Friday during the final month of the season, mixed teams made up of players from different age groups will compete in organized matches. This format allows us to alter contexts, amplify our playing identity, and generate emotional challenges that are harder to recreate in regular training.

Why do we do it?
Because it works.

This initiative is directly inspired by the training structure of Barça Academy in Barcelona. Those of you who have seen the Barcelona Academy World Cup (BAWC) have witnessed first-hand the level and emotional maturity their players possess. This maturity is not only built through external competition, but through internal environments like this one that promote creativity, adaptability, and intention.

During the Internal League, we create game conditions aligned with our weekly focus, whether it's playing under pressure, recovering the ball, or interpreting space. The different constraints we add each week ensures that players are constantly challenged to think, solve, and adapt.

We encourage all families to give the Internal League the importance it deserves. It is a fundamental part of the Barça methodology and one of the reasons why our players continue to grow with purpose, not just playing more, but playing better.

INTERNAL LEAGUE RULES – 1st GAME

Week 1 – Internal League Game Rules & Methodological Focus

This first Friday marks the beginning of our Internal League, a learning space where players from different teams and age groups will be mixed to foster new dynamics, interactions, and individual growth. Every week, each team will play against one of the four other teams in a 5v5 format.

For this first game, we have implemented a specific set of rules that align with the methodological focus of the week: **the Recovery Moment**. Over the last two weeks, players have been practising on:

- Reacting immediately after losing possession
- Understanding how and when to press
- Adopting a proactive defensive mindset
- Taking initiative even without the ball
- Reducing space and time for the opponent to act
- Forcing the opposition into less favorable areas

To promote these learning intentions, this week's rules are designed to maximize exposure to these moments:

- 5v5 teams:** Increases repetitions of key game situations and direct interactions with the ball.
- 35-minute halves:** Creates longer game phases to challenge attention and physical adaptation.
- Extra Penalty:** gives them the opportunity to react as fast as possible after a recovery and understand that the other team can be disorganized
- No goalkeeper in second half:** Forces players to press forward to the one with the ball and have an excellent reaction after a lose.
- No offside:** Encourages players to understand the spatial occupation without relying on positional rules.
- No fixed positions:** Promotes adaptability, rotation, and responsibility for covering spaces based on the situation, not the label.

The absence of traditional positional roles and the continuous nature of play invite players to read the game context, anticipate actions, and collaborate with teammates to recover the ball efficiently. This environment reflects our commitment to developing players with autonomy, game intelligence, and a collective mindset.

Let's enjoy the process and use this league as a space to challenge, grow, and play the Barça way — even without the ball.





TOURNAMENTS

In addition to the leagues and friendly games, the BARÇA Academy Chicago staff will work on selecting the best tournaments according to the club standards and will invite teams considering the different aspects of the tournaments, always prioritizing the players interests and development needs.

BARÇA Academy Chicago teams are required to attend any scheduled tournament by the BARÇA Academy staff. Team families must confirm their commitment to a tournament before the established deadline in order to proceed with the team's registration.

Generally, BARÇA Academy Chicago teams will play at least 3-4 tournaments during the year, to prepare the different seasons. Additionally, some selected teams will also have the opportunity to participate in international tournaments (BAWC, Las Americas, MIC).

Tournament fees are not included in club fees, it is for this reason that families will be invoiced via SportsEngine and will be expected to cover their portion of the cost in order too participate

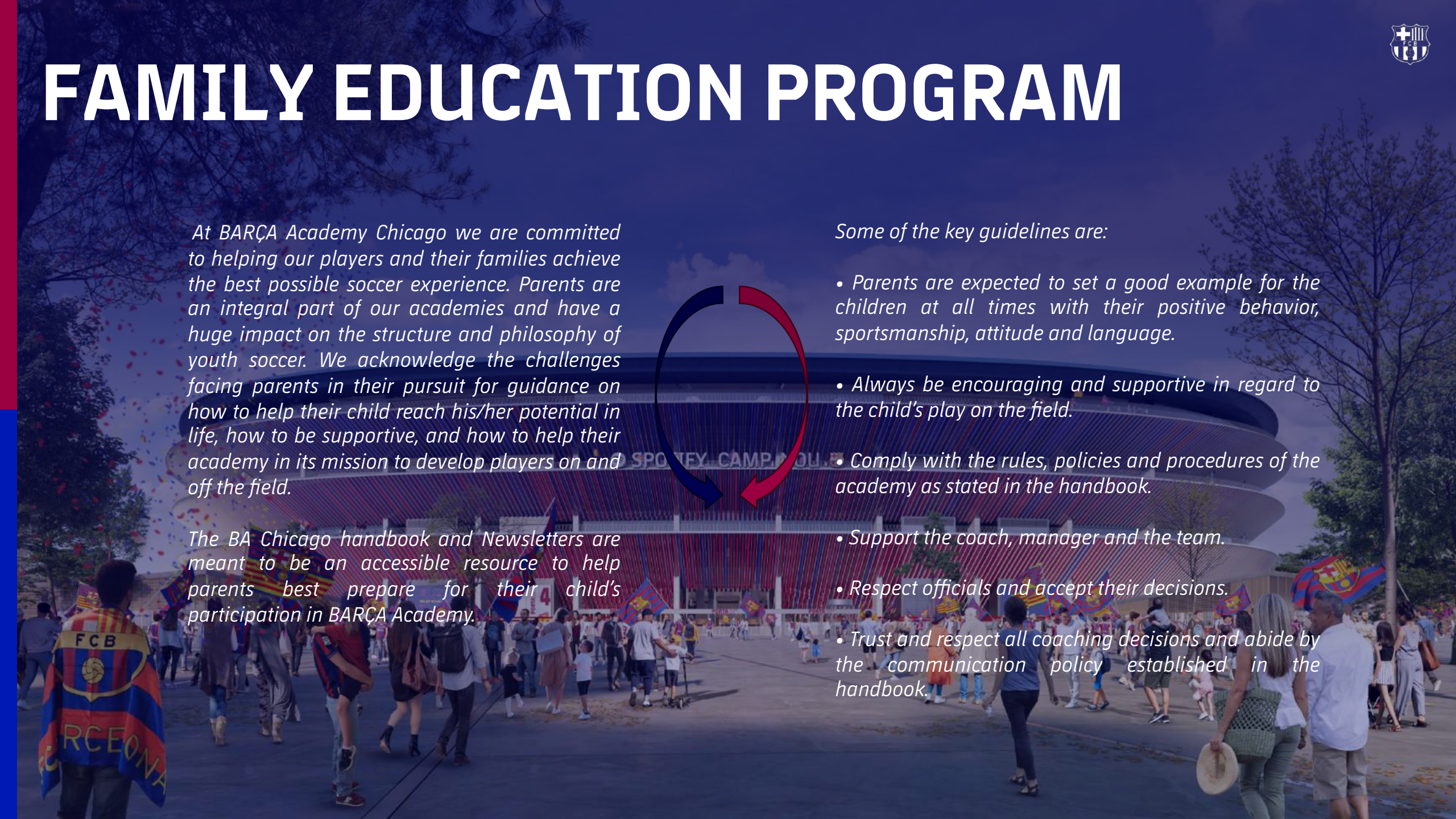
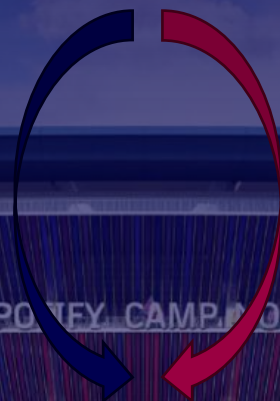
FAMILY EDUCATION PROGRAM

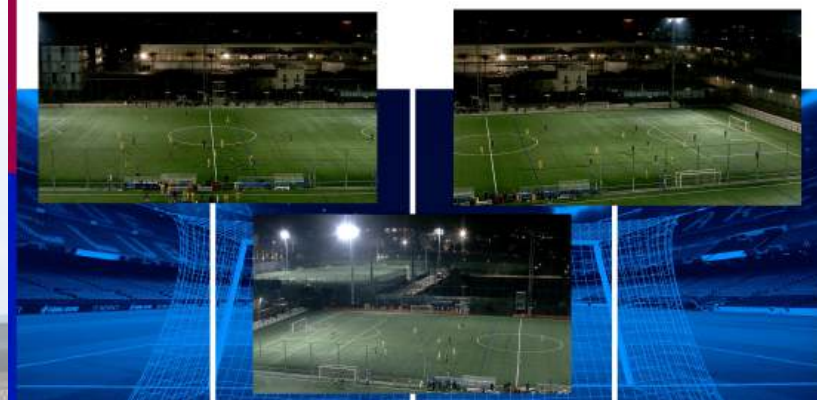




VIDEO ANALYSIS

PARENTS EXPECTATIONS

Expectations, rules and penalties

Parents are encouraged to always follow these guidelines when representing the BARÇA Academy Chicago at training, games, tournaments or other club events.

Failure to adhere to the policies outlined in this document may result in parents being unable to attend games and in some extreme cases players being removed from the club.

We know that most BARÇA Academy Chicago parents already understand and adhere to the policies contained in this document and we would like to take this opportunity to thank you for continuing to do so.

PARENTS EXPECTATIONS

Rules and penalties

1. Parent Sideline Behavior

We want to be known across the state for the excellent support of our parents and good sportsmanship during soccer games. Parents are asked to sit on one half of the field of play and the team bench should be situated on the opposite half of the field on the same side.

A good distance, about 20 yards, should be kept between the team and the closest parent.

Parents are prohibited from the field of play and should never walk behind or near to the bench during the game or halftime.

Parents are welcome to support the team during games as much as they would like but are asked to keep comments to praise and encouragement for the team only.

Parents should refrain from “coaching type comments” at all times and allow the head coach to provide the instruction and direction as the game is being played.

Negative comments directed at BARÇA Academy players, opposition players and officials are unacceptable and parents engaging in this type of communication will be asked to stop by the head coach or team manager immediately.

Parents who continue these types of comments will be asked to leave the game if they do not stop and will be reported to the Directors who will deal with the issue further.

2. 24 Hour Rule

The club has a 24-hour rule in effect which means that parents should wait 24-hours after a game before contacting a coach or a director with an issue or conflict from a game.

This waiting period allows time for some reflection from both parties and usually takes the emotional response away which tends to result in the potential conflict being handled in a much more effective manner.

We ask that all parents always respect the 24-hour rule. This applies to phone calls, emails and text messages.



PLAYERS EXPECTATIONS

Rules and penalties

Rules:

- 1.Players must dress in proper BARÇA Academy attire with the proper soccer equipment.
- 2.Players (also families!) will not protest the referee decisions. The referees will make mistakes. The BARÇA Academy Chicago staff will handle all referee issues during matches
3. The players must use proper language whether in public or indoors.
- 4.At the conclusion of every match, players must shake hands with the referees and opponents. After shaking hands, the players will go to the center of the field and applaud the supporters (parents) in gratitude for their support then go to a corner of the field and cool down and stretch as a team. The coach will then provide feedback and recap the game. Parents are not allowed to approach the players during this time period.
- 5.Players have to wait near the field until they are gathered by the coach and led out to practice by the coach. After practice, they are led to greet the parents.
- 6.Players are not allowed to leave the field during, before or after a match or training session unless it is an emergency, or the coach gives the player permission. Players must always shake hands with the staff before leaving.
- 7.BARÇA Academy attire promotes our club values; you must therefore take care of your jersey and always respect the badge. Players must always have their tops tucked in neatly and are not allowed to take their jerseys off during training or games.
- 8.The players are not allowed to wear chains, bracelets, watches or any dangerous accessories during the training sessions and/or matches.
- 9.The attitude of the players on the bench must be as professional as the players on the field. Players are not allowed to eat meals on the bench; interact with fans, opponents, or teammates on the field. Players are not allowed to use their mobile devices during meetings, games, and/or training sessions.
- 10.Only players and BARÇA Academy staff are allowed on the BARÇA Academy bench and sideline.



PLAYERS EXPECTATIONS

Rules and penalties

Penalties:

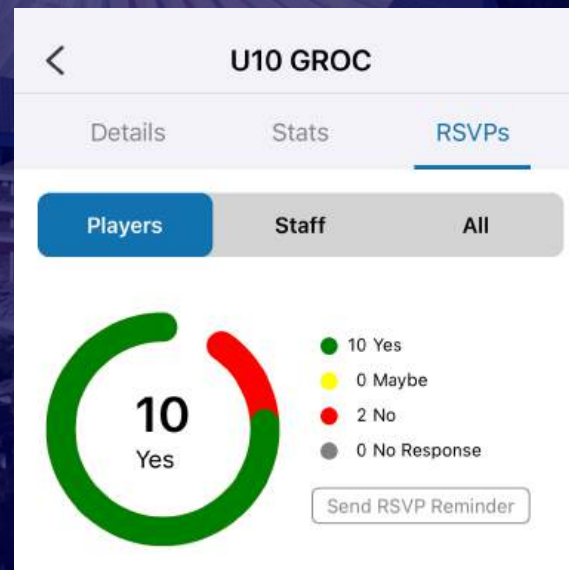
1. A minor offense will be punished with a warning.
2. Two to three minor offenses will be punished with a 1-match ban.
3. Being late to training or a match, and not informing the coach could result in the coach refraining from using the players in the game or session.
4. Any player arriving late to a match cannot be a starter. If the player is repetitively late, they will have to sit out the game.
5. Any damage a player causes to the facility or equipment will be paid for by the player.
6. A disrespectful attitude while on the pitch in front of your teammates or coaches during the match will result in an automatic substitution and possible suspension.
7. Any serious misconduct will be punished according to its severity.
