# 1. Welcome to BARÇA Academy Chicago

Welcome to the 2026/27 Barça Academy Chicago season.

This handbook is designed to help families understand how the academy works, what we expect from players and families, and how we will continue building a strong development environment for the upcoming year.

Barça Academy Chicago is more than a soccer program. It is a player development project based on methodology, values, education, competition, and community. Our goal is to help players grow on and off the field while representing the Barça identity with pride and responsibility.



## 2. Identity, Mission, Vision, and Values

### 2.1 Our Identity

Barça Academy Chicago is part of the global Barça Academy project, inspired by FC Barcelona's playing style, educational approach, and core values. We aim to develop intelligent, creative, courageous, respectful players who understand the game and act responsibly within a team environment.

### 2.2 Mission

To provide players in Chicago with a high-quality soccer education based on the Barça methodology, helping them improve technically, tactically, physically, cognitively, emotionally, and socially.

### 2.3 Vision

To become a reference soccer academy in the Midwest by creating a strong development pathway, a clear game identity, a positive family culture, and meaningful competitive experiences.

### 2.4 HEART Values

**Humility** - Stay grounded, be coachable, and respect everyone.

**Effort** - Give your best every day, not only on game day.

**Ambition** - Want to improve, compete, and grow.

**Respect** - Respect teammates, opponents, referees, coaches, families and the game.

**Teamwork** - Understand that individual growth happens inside a collective environment.



# 3. The BARÇA Methodology

## Team & Player-Centered Development

The academy prioritizes the long-term development of each player. Winning is important, but it is not the only indicator of progress. We evaluate how players understand the game, make decisions, compete, and represent the academy values.

## Understanding the game

Players are encouraged to interpret situations instead of memorizing fixed answers. The goal is to develop players who can perceive, decide, and execute according to the context of the game.

## Training Through Game Situations

Training sessions are designed using game-based environments, constraints, and representative situations. This allows players to experience realistic problems and learn how to solve them.

## Roles in the learning process

**Coach:** Guides, challenges, supports, asks questions, creates problems, and helps players discover solutions.

**Player:** Must be a protagonist of their own development: brave, focused, respectful, responsible, and willing to learn.

**Family:** Supports the process through encouragement, patience, trust, and respect for the learning environment.

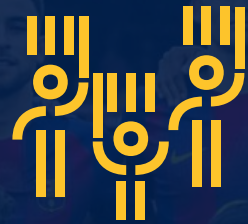

## Player Placement Criteria



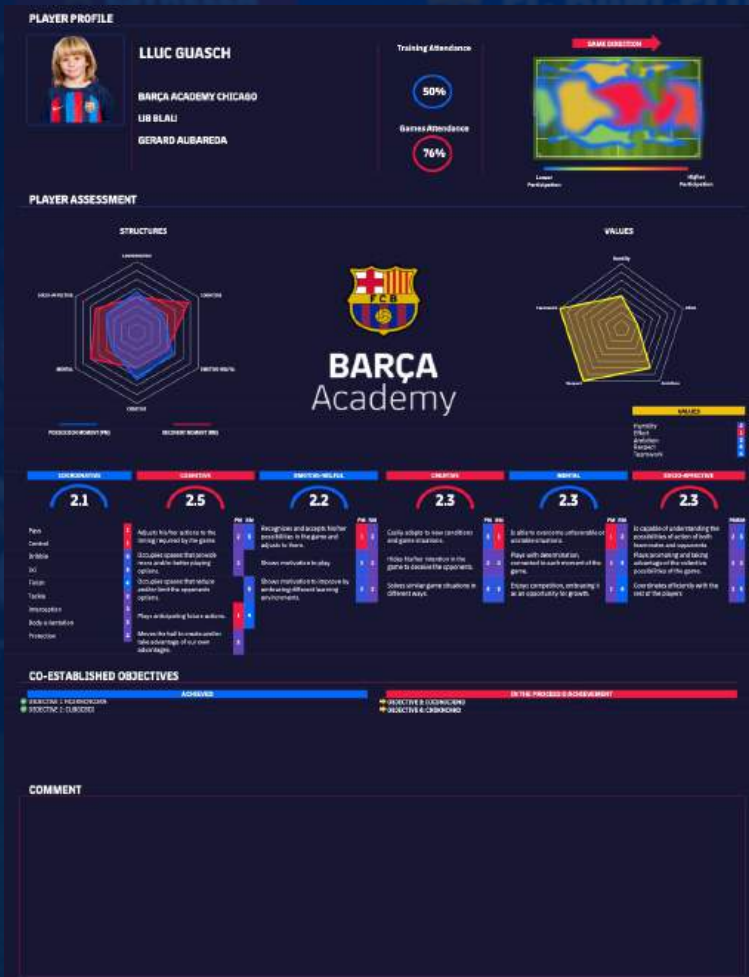
- Coordinative execution
- Game (space, ball, advantages) understanding
- Decision-making
- Training consistency / commitment
- Competitive behavior and performance
- Emotional maturity
- Team & Player needs

Some players may be invited to train or play with older teams, higher-level groups, or additional sessions. These opportunities are used as development tools and do not automatically mean permanent promotion. When appropriate, players may be double rostered or called up to support another team based on development, level, availability, roster needs, and readiness.

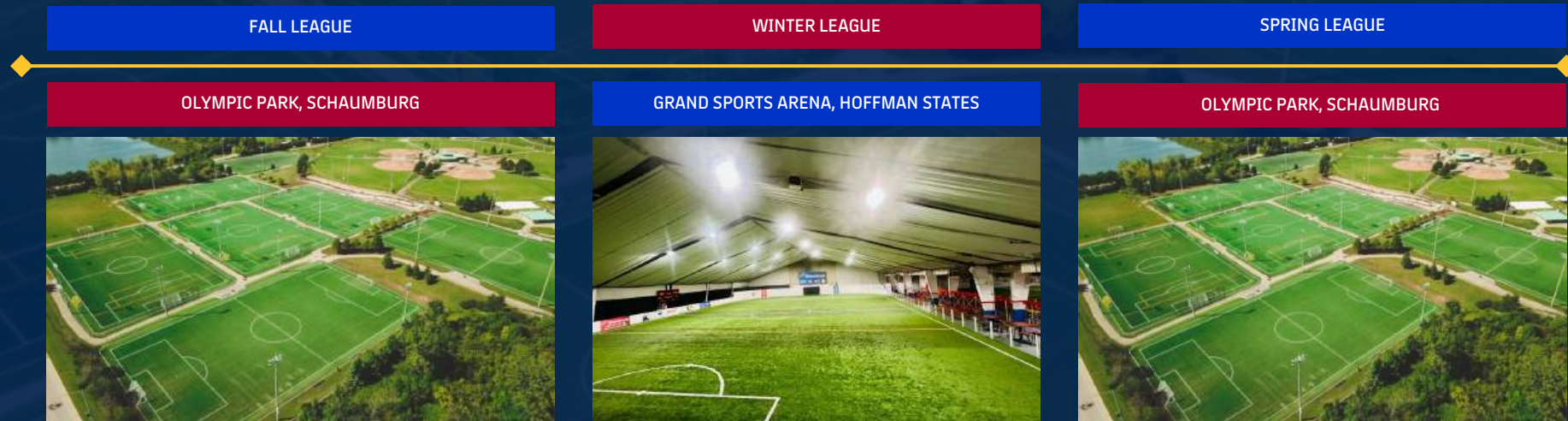

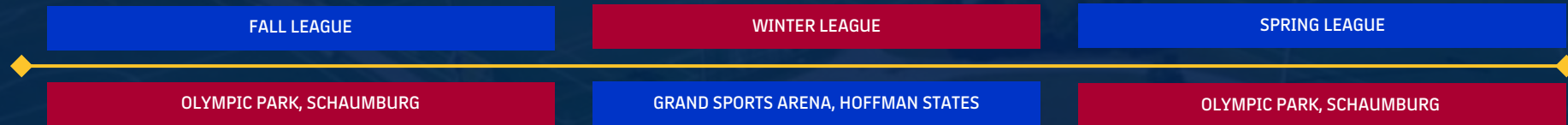
## Training Locations

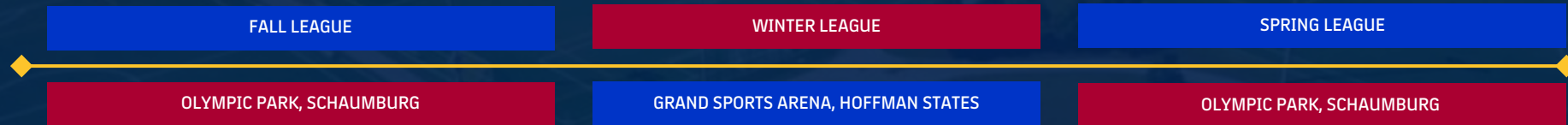

## Weather and Facility Changes



The academy may adjust, relocate, or cancel sessions due to field closures, lightning, heavy rain, extreme cold, or facility restrictions. Families will be notified as soon as possible through official communication channels.



# 6. Training Expectations



## ATTENDANCE & COMMITMENT



Regular attendance is essential for individual and team development. **Missing training affects learning, rhythm, team connection, and game preparation.**

## PLAYER PREPARATION



- **Correct Barça Academy uniform**
  - Shin guards
  - Soccer cleats or turf shoes depending on facility
  - Water bottle
  - Appropriate layers in cold weather

## TRAINING BEHAVIOR



- Listen actively
- Respect coaches and teammates
- Make mistakes with courage
  - Help teammates
  - Stay focused during explanations
- **Represent the academy values**

# 7. Uniforms and Equipment Policy



## BLUE



TUESDAY / FRIDAY

For the 2026/27 season, Barça Academy Chicago will introduce a **new official uniform package**. Families will receive the final ordering information, deadlines, sizing details, and required items before the start of the season.

## RED



THURSDAY

The academy will publish an official weekly practice uniform calendar before the season begins. Families must follow the assigned colors for each training day.

# 7. Uniforms and Equipment Policy

## Uniforms Expectations



### Cold Weather Apparel

During cold weather, players are allowed to wear additional layers as long as they respect the academy image.

Black or Barça Academy-colored base layers

- Thermal undershirts under the official jersey
- Thermal leggings or tights under shorts when needed
- Gloves
- Neck warmers when safe and permitted by the coach/referee
- Winter hats during warm-ups, training, or sideline moments when allowed

### Hats, Beanies, and Accessories

Hats and beanies may be used in cold weather during training, warm-ups, or when players are on the bench. Barça Academy or FC Barcelona winter hat when available

- Neutral black winter hat or Barça / Nike hat
- Gloves in neutral or academy colors
- Simple neck warmer without unsafe elements

### Inner Shirts and Base Layers

Players may wear inner shirts or thermal base layers under the official jersey when needed. These should be simple, tight-fitting, and black or academy colors.

Oversized hoodies, non-academy sweatshirts, or visible non-official apparel should not be worn over the official training or game uniform unless specifically allowed by the coach due to weather conditions.

### Uniform Discipline

Uniform standards are part of the academy's culture. They help create a professional environment, reinforce team identity, and teach players responsibility.

Families are expected to help players prepare their uniform and equipment before each session or game.

Repeated failure to follow the uniform policy may affect participation.

# 8. Game Day Expectations



## MATCH DAY PHILOSOPHY



Games are a key part of the learning process. We **compete to win**, but we also **compete to learn, improve, and represent the Barça identity**.

## ARRIVAL TIME AND UNIFORM



Players should usually arrive **45 minutes before kickoff** unless the coach communicates otherwise.

Players should **bring both official game uniforms** whenever requested, especially during tournaments or events where color conflicts may occur.

## PLAYING TIME POLICY



The academy aims to provide meaningful playing opportunities while considering **the competitive context, player commitment, attendance, effort, behavior, level, and team needs**.

Playing time may vary depending on training attendance, game context, roster size, player readiness, and tactical needs.

## SIDELINE BEHAVIOUR

Families should support positively and avoid coaching from the sideline. Players need to make decisions independently and listen to their coach.



- Encourage all player
- Respect referees
- Respect opponents
- Avoid tactical instructions
- Avoid negative comments
- Model Barça values



For emotionally charged situations, families should wait 24 hours before raising concerns. This allows everyone to communicate with perspective and respect.

# 9. Competitions, Leagues & Pathway



The **National 1 League (N1)** is a new competition launching in the **2026/27 season**, created by **US Club Soccer and US Youth Soccer** to bring together the previous **NPL** and **National League** structures into one clearer national platform. It is designed as the top team-based competition within both organizations and connects local, regional, and national competition into a more organized player pathway.

For Barça Academy Chicago, N1 can become an important step in the player development pathway because it gives our teams access to stronger competition, clearer progression, and greater visibility. The league is also connected with the broader **ECNL Regional League pathway**, where high-performing clubs and teams may have opportunities to progress toward higher competitive platforms.

# 10. New Age Group Rule for 2026/27



Starting in the **2026/27 season**, major youth soccer organizations in the U.S. will move from **birth-year grouping** to a **school-year style age grouping**.

## What is changing?

**Current system:** January 1 – December 31

**New system:** August 1 – July 31

This change will be applied by major U.S. youth soccer organizations starting in Fall 2026/27.

## How will Barça Academy Chicago apply it?

Barça Academy Chicago will apply this change for the **2026/27 season**.

Teams and player placement will be adjusted following the new age-group structure.

Families will receive the provisional rosters when we finish the renewals and tryouts

## Why is this an opportunity?

- Better **alignment with school** classmates and social groups.
- Helps reduce “trapped players” situations.
- Creates a clearer and more **natural development pathway**.
- Supports continuity, belonging, and the overall player experience.
- Player development does not happen by always staying in the same stable environment. New teammates, new relationships, and new group dynamics create valuable learning opportunities.
- This change can help **players adapt, communicate with different teammates, face new challenges, and continue growing** both as players and as people.

# 11. Special Programs (IMPROVED)

## Video-Analysis Sessions

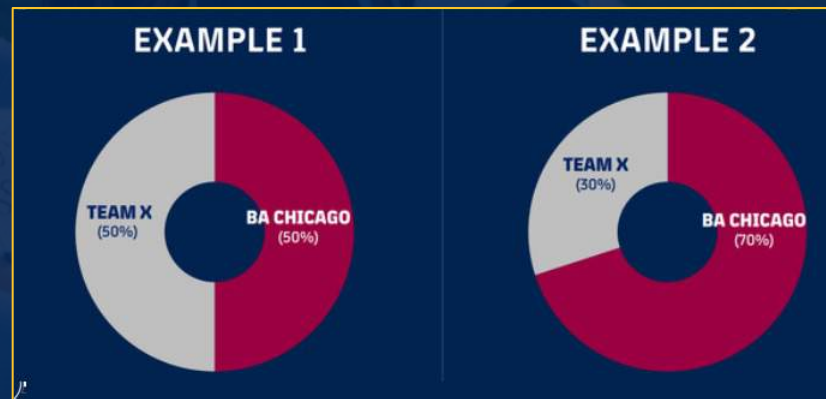


The academy will continue developing its **Video Analysis Program** as a key tool to help players better understand the game.



For the 2026/27 season, our goal is to offer:

- **Three academy-wide video analysis sessions during the year.**
- **One individualized video analysis session per team.**



• Team-specific clips connected to our methodology, game model, and weekly learning objectives.

• Reflection moments to help players understand decisions in the **Possession Moment & Recovery Moment**

• The objective is to help players see the game from a different perspective, improve their decision-making, and connect what they experience on the field with what they analyze off the field.

# 11. Special Programs

## Internal League

During the last two seasons, the academy has offered the **U8–U10 Internal League** during the **Fall or Spring season** as an additional FREE program. If field availability and scheduling allow it, the academy's goal is to continue offering this opportunity as an extra program for the 2026/27 season.

The Internal League allows players to:

- Play more game minutes in a structured environment.
- Compete in balanced teams and rotating formats.
- Experience different roles and responsibilities.
- Make decisions with less coach intervention.
- Improve their understanding of the GAME.
- Learn how to adapt to different rules, spaces, teammates, and opponents.
- Develop competitiveness while reinforcing Barça Academy values.

This program is not only about playing more games. It is a learning environment where the academy can use specific rules, constraints, and formats to create different problems for the players to solve. These adaptations help players improve their perception, decision-making, creativity, and autonomy.

The Internal League also helps players build confidence, take more responsibility, and enjoy competition in a positive and familiar academy environment.

Participation, age groups, schedules, and format will depend on field availability, number of registered players, staff availability, and the academy calendar. Final details will be communicated before each season.



# 11. Special Programs (NEW)

## Nutrition Advisory Program

The academy aims to introduce a **Nutrition Advisory Program** to support players and families with general guidance around eating habits, health, recovery, and performance.

This program may include:

- Basic nutrition guidelines for young athletes.
- Pre-training and pre-game meal recommendations.
- Recovery nutrition tips.
- Hydration habits.
- Education for families on how nutrition impacts energy, focus, growth, and performance.

The goal is not to create strict diets, but to provide players and families with practical tools to build healthier routines.



# 11. Special Programs (NEW)

## Online Conditional Optimization Program



The academy also plans to offer an **Online Physical Optimization Program** to help players improve their conditioning habits outside regular team sessions.

This program may include:

- Age-appropriate mobility routines.
- Injury prevention exercises.
- Strength and coordination guidance.
- Recovery and stretching recommendations.
- Optional at-home conditional preparation content.

Education on sleep, rest, and weekly load management.

The goal is to help players become more responsible for their own physical development and create better habits throughout the season.



# 11. Special Programs (NEW)

## Educational Presentations and Guest Speakers



Throughout the season, the academy aims to organize **educational presentations for players, families, and coaches.**

Potential topics may include:

- Nutrition and young athlete development.
- Mental performance and emotional management.
- Injury prevention.
- College pathway information.
- Player habits and routines.
- Barça methodology.
- Family role in player development.

These sessions are designed to give families and players additional tools to support development beyond the field.



# 11. Special Programs

## Internal Program – Coach Education



To maintain a consistent academy identity, Barça Academy Chicago will continue investing in coach education.

This may include:

- Internal coach formations.
- Methodology meetings before all practices.
- Session design workshops.
- Video analysis with coaches.
- Barça methodology updates.
- Guest presentations from Barça Academy staff or external specialists.



The objective is to ensure that players receive a coherent learning experience across all age groups and teams.

# 15. Communication with families



As part of our commitment to keep improving the academy experience, Barça Academy Chicago will be introducing **CoachBetter** as the main communication and management platform for the 2026/27 season.

After using **SportsEngine** in previous seasons, the academy has decided to transition to CoachBetter in order to offer families a more organized, efficient, and professional experience. # 16. External Programs, Recruitment &



## Conflict of Interest

**Barça Academy Chicago** respects each family's right to participate in private training, tournaments, camps, trips, or other soccer activities outside of the Academy. However, any external activity must remain completely independent unless it has been officially approved and communicated by Barça Academy Chicago.

No parent, player, coach, volunteer, or external individual may use Barça Academy Chicago's community, players, families, team relationships, communication channels, brand, image, reputation, or internal environment to promote, recruit for, organize, or financially benefit an external soccer program, academy, team, tournament, camp, trip, or private training service.

This includes recruiting Academy players, promoting external activities through team chats or private groups, using Barça Academy Chicago's name or image, creating confusion about official affiliation, or sharing internal information, player data, training comparisons, or Academy-related discussions in a way that may misrepresent or damage the Academy.

Any external activity must be clearly presented as **independent and not affiliated with Barça Academy Chicago**.

Barça Academy Chicago reserves the right to take action if these boundaries are not respected, including formal warnings, restriction from communication channels or team environments, and review of the family's continued participation in the Academy. Our priority is to protect a respectful, transparent, and trusted environment for all players, families, and staff.



# 17. Code of Conduct



## PLAYERS

- Represent the Barça Academy Chicago badge with **Humility, Effort, Ambition, Respect, and Teamwork.**
- Arrive on time and prepared for training, games, tournaments, and academy events.
- Wear the correct uniform and bring all required equipment.
- Respect coaches, teammates, opponents, referees, families, and facility staff.
- Give maximum effort, stay focused, accept feedback, and take responsibility for their development.
- Support teammates and understand that individual growth happens within the team.
- Manage frustration, mistakes, pressure, and competition with maturity.



## FAMILIES

- Support the player development process with patience, trust, and positivity.
- Respect coaches, players, referees, opponents, other families, academy staff, and facility staff.
- Encourage players from the sideline without coaching, criticizing, or giving tactical instructions.
- Communicate concerns privately, respectfully, and through the proper academy channels.
- Respect the **24-hour rule** before discussing emotional topics such as playing time, roster decisions, game management, or conflicts.
- Complete RSVPs and availability updates by the communicated deadlines.
- Help players arrive on time, prepared, and wearing the correct uniform.
- Use team chats in a responsible way.

**Behavior that goes against academy values may lead to appropriate consequences, including meetings, warnings, reduced participation, suspension from games or events, restricted sideline access, or further disciplinary action if needed.**

By being part of Barça Academy Chicago, players and families agree to protect the learning environment and contribute to a culture based on respect, responsibility, commitment, and long-term development.
